

FROM PASTOR TIM

Deeply Thankful for Sabbatical

The sabbatical time you as a congregation granted me was fantastic – beyond what I had prayed for! The chronology was an opening hermitage solitude time, then a trip to Great Britain with my wife Laura, then an expanse of time at home to focus on learning my family history in ways that are wonderfully connecting me with extended family, then a closing hermitage solitude time. All this has come together in a deeply renewing way. I share with you now just a few facets of the experience.

In Oxford, England, where Laura had spent a year of her college education, I got to hear her memories as we walked the city and visited her sites. Laura had regularly attended the evening sung worships at Christ College, and it was moving for us to sit next to the choir and experience Evensong together.



After a few days in Oxford, we continued on into the England countryside of the Cotswolds, an expanse of green pastures dotted by quaint villages – many built up in the 1500s when the wool industry was at its height. We stayed for a week in a cottage in the town of Chipping Campden (population 2000), and went on many long walks along the footpaths leading out and back from the town's central market place (built in 1100). Often times these trails out into the country went right through pastures of sheep ("remember to close the gate after yourself"). Who knew that being among sheep could be so peaceful? Green pastures.

After Sunday morning worship at the town's St. James church (they celebrated their 500th anniversary some years ago), we were welcomed by very kind, fascinating people, and after worship we visited until all were gone, and I couldn't help but think of you here at home.

After a sublime week in the Cotswolds, we drove up to the Lake District, the land of Beatrix Potter and William Wordsworth. We spent some time at an ancient stone circle, and wondered at the spirituality of the people who created it. We stayed at a farmhouse bed and breakfast, and took a day to hike to the top of the Catsbells overlooking Derwentwater Lake near Keswick. The wind pulsed strong enough to knock me over once, and we learned that every year people get blown off ridges. Our walks brought us again through green pastures with various kinds of sheep. Walking and walking, looking out over still waters, we experienced the profound beauty and goodness of God's creation.

The Isle of Iona off the coast of Scotland was our next stop (after a harrowing drive to Oban, a ferry ride to the Island of Mull, a fun guided bus tour across Mull, and then a short ferry ride to Iona). We saw the Abbey as the ferry approached the island. It was tucked into a low hill along the shoreline in a way that made it look like it had been there forever. The religious community that founded it began in the 6th century when St. Columba boated across from Ireland to create a Christian movement there.

The Isle of Iona is about three miles long and a mile wide. It has about 100 people who live there year around. And it carries a peacefulness that has drawn pilgrims from around the world for centuries.

Worship at the ancient Abbey was at 9:00 am and 9:00 pm. As we walked in over the stone floor in the morning, we heard the kind of piano music Linda Turpening plays for us during the Imposition of Ashes at the beginning of Lent. There were about three dozen of us – just the right size for the space, and when it was time for worship to begin, the piano music stopped and the worship leader lead us into a silent worship. A half hour later, a community prayer was shared and we left, blessed. We came back that evening and experienced a sung vespers worship. Blessed. And then again the following morning – this time a spoken liturgy. Blessed.

During the day on the island we walked north, opening and closing the gates so the sheep stayed were they were supposed to be, and meandered along the ocean coastline. At some point we sat on a green grassy bluff I ooking out over the blue ocean, and then laid back to look at the sky. For a long time.

The Lord is my shepherd. He makes me lie down in green pastures. He leads me beside still waters. He restores my soul.


Create, Laugh, Learn!


