You won't find them labeled as such on a calendar, but these are the layers of complexity that come to us this summer:

COVID-19

We can glimpse the other side of the pandemic as we return to in-person worship and the possibility of indoor gatherings with few protocols, other than to love our neighbor.

Interim period

As we welcome Pastor Nancy we glance back with thanksgiving and forward with openness to the future to which God is calling us. After 14 months of unknown and challenge we long for rest and healing. Mission and Vision

We now have the opportunity to deepen our identity as a community of Christ. We will listen to God's Word and to each other while also listening to the cry of our world for meaning and purpose.

Sabbath rest

The time has come for me and for us as a congregation to drink deeply from the still waters of sabbath rest. In all of these "seasons" happening this summer, God is with us!

#### Worship

During the exile of the pandemic, the "place" where we continued to gather as a community was our online worship services. Led by our Vision council and SMART Team we have followed science and the Holy Spirit to provide safe and meaningful worship experiences. Thanks be to God and to all of you! This particular season of limited protocols will continue until all under the age of 12 have the opportunity to be protected through vaccination. We are learning how to navigate worship in the sanctuary safely and also how to continue to provide a quality online experience for those not yet able to come in person. We are so thankful for the skill and spirit of our worship and tech teams, and are deeply appreciative of the expertise of our professional tech consultants from Citon. Thank you for your patience and participation as we navigate this new edge of our ministry.

#### Mission and Vision

The interim period provides us with the opportunity to take a fresh look at every expression of our ministry and to consider what "new thing" God is calling us to in this season of our history. Our Vision Council has set up a 6-9 month process to extend the 2003 Mission and Vision Statement to the present and into the future. Thank you to Dave Chura and Sara Hendrickson for serving as cochairs, to all those who will serve on the Task Force, and to each of you who will share your dreams through surveys, home gatherings, small group conversations and congregational consensus. What an exciting season!

#### Sabbath rest

Following the clarity that emerges from of the Mission and Vision update our congregation will be in a position to begin a call process. We have realized that it will not be possible for me to reschedule my postponed sabbatical during that time. Thanks to the presence of Pastor Nancy and our strong congregational leadership it has become clear that "now" is the time for a deep sabbath renewal for both me and our congregation. #### Relaxation Group to Begin as Part of Core Ministry

Our body-mind-spirits were designed by our Creator to be at ease. Yet when we experience stress we switch into high alert as if we're in imminent danger. This stress response affects our body, minds, and spirits. To move back into a state of ease we can practice a variety of skills including easy movements, gentle belly breathing, and simple meditation techniques.

This group will be led by Pastor Nancy Hong, a teacher of relaxation and yoga for 16 years. She understands this group as a part of her call to LCGS because this practice will help heal our bodies, minds and spirits after various "stress-full" situations over the last few years.

We'll meet in the Gathering Center on Tuesdays during July at 4:00 p.m. for 4 weeks, beginning July 6. Feel free to come to one class or all four!

This practice can be done in a chair or from the floor. Also, everyone should bring a blanket and a pillow. If you're going to be on the floor bring a mat or a second blanket to lay on. This practice is open to confirmation students and older. Wear comfortable, loose clothing.

#### Dear members of Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd,



I am writing to you as the chair of the LCGS Consultative committee, which also serves as the Sabbatical Team for our pastors. I share you with great news - the time for Pastor Dave's sabbatical is upon us!

In 2018 and 2019, our sabbatical team worked with Pastor Dave to create the space and good process for his sabbatical. We met regularly, talked with Human Resources, the Resource Development Team, the Vision Council, the Endowment Fund, the staff and the entire congregation. We wholeheartedly approved his sabbatical. As the year progressed, there were reasons it could not unfold as planned and so Pastor Dave graciously agreed to move it to 2020. Again, we spent time planning and confirming, choosing dates, creating ways all of us could participate in a like manner . . . and then the pandemic struck in March 2020. Clearly that was not the time.

The Holy Spirit has made it clear - **this is the time!** Pastor Nancy is a phenomenal pastor who is abundantly capable of leading our congregation and has the deep desire to support our staff in her time with us. There are so many big, exciting things that will be happening this fall and into next year - mission and vision work, calling a new pastor, bringing our new pastor into our congregation and teaching them about our workings - during which we will need Pastor Dave. This moment in time - this time RIGHT NOW - is so clearly right for it. I think of how Pastor Nancy talked about the Holy Spirit on Pentecost and I know deep in my heart she is here for a reason. She has much to share. And upholding Pastor Dave's sabbatical is a part of it.

The Sabbatical Team met on June 8 and approved Pastor Dave's sabbatical, with a launch date of the June 27 worship service and an ending date of September 7. There is years' worth of planning and preparation involved in this and we as a congregation will be invited to share in the same types of activities as Pastor Dave will do - Listening to the Voice of God through reading the Psalms, hiking the Superior Hiking Trail, and listening to opera. We are also making space for him to complete his sabbatical in the latter half of February 2022. Pastor Dave did not feel he could be gone longer this summer as he did not want to miss Rally Sunday. And so to honor what a sabbatical is, we've created the space to complete it later.

Please join me in celebrating all that God is doing in our church. Join me and so many others in reading the Psalms, hiking portions of the Superior Hiking Trail and listening to opera during Pastor Dave's sabbatical, so that we can share in this spiritual renewal.

## A COMMUNITY OF CHRIST EXPERIENCING GOD, REACHING OUT, NURTURING FAITH

Our Mission and Vision Statement is gold! It is biblically based, spiritually transformative, and it has emerged from the soul of our congregation. It tells us who we are in our deepest identity (a community of Christ), and how we are called to live out that identity in the world today (meaningful worship, local and global mission, nurturing the faith of all). This Statement emerged through the leadership of the Transition Task Force in 2002-2003 by a comprehensive process of listening in two directions: 1) listening to the voice of our congregation through survey responses, interviews and small group conversations, and 2) studying the demographics of our community. This statement has shaped our ministry by transforming our leadership structure, guiding our staff configuration, and determining our budget.

So what has changed since 2003? The biblical basis of our mission and vision remains as powerful as ever. But the world in which we live out that mission and vision continues to change rapidly. The Mission and Vision Statement of 2003 was intended to guide our ministry for 3-5 years. Since 2003 we have been blessed with new members who bring diverse gifts to our calling as a congregation. The rapid cultural changes in the past decade are well documented. In the past 15 months the COVID-19 pandemic has impacted every dimension of our lives and ministry. Today we find ourselves facing the necessity and the opportunity of updating our mission and vision expressions to fit the current reality. We are being called to bring the transforming power of Christ to our worship, mission outreach, faith development, volunteer and staff leadership, and budget decisions in a fresh way.

As "keepers of the vision," your Vision Council is creating a Mission and Vision Task Force (MVTF) to guide our congregation in a fresh process of listening to the voices of our community and our world. The task force will be co-chaired by Dave Chura and Sara Hendrickson. Members of the MVTF will represent the full spectrum of age, experience, and ministry involvement of our congregation.

In the next 6-9 months all will have the opportunity to share in the process through:

Survey Interviews Small group conversations Home gatherings
